


#### 1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7

Thus says the LORD: Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am pleased, upon whom I have put my spirit; he shall bring forth justice to the nations, not crying out, not shouting, not making his voice heard in the street. A bruised reed he shall not break, and a smoldering wick he shall not quench, until he establishes justice on the earth; the coastlands will wait for his teaching. #### Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.


John said: One mightier than I is coming; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire.

#### (homily for Children)

This is an exciting time. It is the beginning of a brand new year. Some people like to make New Year's resolutions or promises to themselves about what they plan to accomplish in the New Year.

I think it is good to have some resolutions and plans to be accomplished in a new year! I have some of them too. For example I would like to pray more this year; I would like dedicate more time for my family and friends, to lose some weight, and a lot more. We all have some resolutions and plans for the New Year. I do not know if we will succeed, but at least we have to try, because this is the only way to change our life for better.

A New Year is always an exciting time. It is a time when we want forget our past mistakes and look forward to new opportunities that lie ahead of us. It is a time of new beginnings.

Jesus experienced times of new beginnings in his life too. One of those times was when he was baptized. There were a couple of very important things that happened when Jesus was baptized. First of all, the Bible tells us that the heavens opened and the Holy Spirit came down in the form of a dove and landed upon him.

The second thing was that God spoke and said, "You are my Son. I love you and I am well-pleased with you."

This event marked the beginning of Jesus' ministry here on earth. Up until that time, he had not performed any miracles, but with God's stamp of approval and with the spirit of God upon him, Jesus began to perform great miracles. From this new beginning, many people began to understand that Jesus was truly the Son of God and they began to follow him.

Our own baptism represents a new beginning for us as well. When we are baptized, it shows the world that just as Jesus rose from the dead through the glory of God the Father, we also live a new life in him. (Romans 6:4) God may not always be well-pleased with us, but I think that He looks down with an approving smile when he sees us trying to walk with Jesus.

New beginnings -- God gives us opportunities for new beginnings. Let us make the most of them as we live a new life in Christ through the power of his Holy Spirit.

#### Let us pray:

Dear Father, thank you for new beginnings. Help us to make the most of them -- not through our own strength -- but through the power of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

#### EPIPHANY BLESSING OF CHALK

It has been a Catholic tradition to bless chalk at the Mass of Epiphany, and then use the blessed chalk as part of blessing one's home in the New Year.

The home blessing can be done as follows: Use the blessed chalk to write: **20+C+M+B+16** above the doorways: 2016 for the year; C, M, B for the 3 Magi – Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar – and for *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, Latin for "May Christ Bless this House".

As you are writing, pray the following prayers:

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is Lord, forever and ever.

#### **Opłatek-Christmas Wafer's History**

For centuries on Christmas Eve, families in Poland, Lithuania, The Czech and Slovak Republic have practiced a beautiful tradition. It is the breaking and sharing of the OPŁATEK-Christmas Wafer. Opłatek taken from the Latin word *oblatum*, meaning Sacred Bread, has been the symbol of the Christianity and Jesus Christ our bread of life.

On the Holiest Night of the year a festive 12 course meatless dinner is prepared for the gathered family and friends. An extra setting is placed for a visitor (Our Lord) who may come to the door, or poor family (the Holy Family) looking for a place to stay. The host or hostess leads the group in a special prayer and distributes an opłatek to the participants. Each person breaks off a piece of the other's opłatek and continues until they have exchanged good wishes and blessings with everyone.

Traditionally at midnight the head of the household takes the pink oplatek and shares it with the animals on his farm or his home.

This custom brings us back to that Holy Night when even animals were able to speak, and to remind us that we are all God's creatures.
