

1st Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter proceeded to speak and said: “You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name.”

2nd Reading: 1 Cor 5: 6b-8.

Brothers and sisters: Do you not know that a little yeast leavens all the dough? Clear out the old yeast, so that you may become a fresh batch of dough, inasmuch as you are unleavened. For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed. Therefore, let us celebrate the feast, not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

Gospel:: John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, “They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don’t know where they put him.” So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

For Reflection:

My Friends in Christ!, today we face the most crucial fact of history: Jesus Christ prevailed over death and raised from the dead. If it is true, life is changing! For us Christians the Resurrection of Jesus is the foundation of our faith. We are here, because Jesus was raised from the dead. We are here because through His resurrection Jesus opened the gates of heaven for everyone of us. And this is the Fact that happened in the history of the humanity, not fairy tale, not a story of fiction. If Jesus was not raised from the dead our faith, our being here doesn’t make any sense. If Jesus was not raised the Apostles’ preaching would be empty and meaningless, our faith would be a lie, the Apostles were false witnesses and liars, and we would

be still in sin, and pitied because we believed in false Messiah.

But we know that He is risen and because of that everything is changed because Jesus' resurrection gives us hope concerning our own resurrection and salvation. We know that He is alive and present in our lives and the empty tomb is a sign of this truth.

Friends in Christ! The resurrection of Jesus is and always was the fundamental and the most important truth of our faith. The Christian communities since the early days lived this truth as the center of their existence. We, like the ancient Christians, are called to live our lives more deeply into the mystery of the resurrection and to be the witnesses of the resurrection of the risen Jesus to others. This fact, so important for us, must have its fulfillment in our lives, in our behavior, in daily activities and in our families.

On this special day I would like to wish every one of you, your families, that the Risen Christ comes to your hearts and homes, that He gives all of you His blessing and fills your hearts with joy and peace for every day of your life. God bless You!


